2017/18 TEACHER GRANTS AWARDED

The Teacher Grant program supports the Foundation's basic objective of recognizing and encouraging outstanding classroom teachers within Garaway Schools. This year \$2,000 was divided among eight applicants granting funds for Compound Bows and arrows for use in Advanced Physical Education Class and Sixth Grade Camp, transportation to education days at the Akron Rubber Ducks game, an instructor for a High School and Middle School choir clinic, a SumoBot Robot Competition Kit for STEM class, supplies for 3D printing projects, ACT prep materials, Whisperphones for students to practice independent reading and improve fluency in grades K-3, and USB presenters for English classrooms at the High School. Garaway is blessed to have teachers who put in extra effort to improve the quality of their students' learning.

SPONSOR A SCHOLARSHIP

Endowing a Scholarship: An endowed scholarship is one in which the principal is invested, and a portion of the interest income from the investment is given annually as a scholarship. An endowed scholarship may be name by the Donor.

"Pass Through" Scholarship: A "pass through" scholarship is a gift of money given to the Foundation for the purpose of awarding a one-time scholarship to a deserving student or contributing annually for the purpose of continuing the scholarship award to deserving students. The Foundation will accept suggested "criterion" from the donor as to the type of student the scholarship is intended to benefit (i.e. for a student in the nursing, education, or engineering field, etc.

Other Gifts to the Foundation: All other gifts and grants to the Foundation will go to the general fund to be invested and used for the development of goals, programs, general endowment scholarship, education grants and growth of the Foundation. 

DISTINGUISHED CITIZEN AWARD - GLENN C. SNYDER

Coach Snyder joined the Garaway High School faculty in 1960. His teaching assignment was in the Business Department teaching shorthand, typing, bookkeeping, consumer economics and business machines. During his first year he was also assigned to coach junior high basketball. Superintendent C. M. Zimmerman and board members also asked him to start an 11 man tackle football team. The first task was to have a practice and game football field constructed. Gary Finzer of Belden Brick Co. was influential in getting this project started. For the first year of football practice the team practiced on an airport runway down by the current bowling alley. Four years later Garaway played their first 11 man football game. During coach's four years at Garaway he also coached the freshmen, and reserve basketball teams. His last year in Sugarcreek, he coached the Garaway varsity basketball team.



Glenn C. Snyder

Dr. Snyder moved on to Bluffton University (Bluffton, OH) in 1964 where he served as a professor, administrator and head

basketball coach for 21 years. Later he moved to Fresno Pacific Univer-

sity (Fresno, CA), Bethel College (Newton, KS), and Hope International University (Fullerton, CA). While living in Sugarcreek he earned his master's degree from Kent State University (Kent, OH). While at Bluffton he earned his doctorate degree from the University of Northern Colorado (Greeley, CO)

His coaching and teaching experience has enabled him to travel with sport teams and play with the Amateur Sports Development USA program in China and Russia. While serving with the United States Sports Academy (Daphne, AL) he was able to teach sport management seminars in Thailand and Malaysia. Due to his sports connections he also traveled to South Korea and recruited students for the American Sports University (San Bernardino, CA).

When he moved to Sugarcreek he was married to Mary Jane Snyder (deceased) who taught at the Miller Avenue School under the leadership of Ernie Raber. During Glenn and Mary Jane's time in Sugarcreek their son Gregg Snyder was born in Dover, OH. After moving to Bluffton, they had a daughter Jill Snyder Peterson born in Lima, OH. Grandpa Snyder is the proud grandfather to eight grandchildren and enjoys attending their school and college events.

Coach Snyder stated that he is thankful to Garaway High School and the Sugarcreek community for getting him and his wife off to a successful start in teaching and coaching. He is thankful for every student he had in the classroom and every student-athlete he coached at Garaway. There were many people that influenced their time in Sugarcreek. Special thanks are given to Arlene and Bill Ray, Ruth and Buz Zehnder (deceased). The First Mennonite Church of Sugarcreek deserves special thanks as this is where he first joined the Mennonite Church.

Since retiring in 2005 from Hope International University he has served on the Kingsburg Hospital Board, Central California Mennonite Residential Services Board and the Randylnn Creek Home Owners Association. Currently, Glenn is on the Kingsburg Tri-County Health Care District Board and is a deacon at the Mennonite Community Church in Fresno, CA.

He serves as an Adjunct Professor at Fresno Pacific University. Coach Snyder continues to coach 8th grade basketball at Rafer Johnson Middle School in Kingsburg, CA. His twin grandsons attend this school.
