DISTINGUISHED CITIZEN AWARD—MARGENE A. STEWART



Margene A. Stewart, daughter of Irene and Adrian Scheetz, graduated from Baltic High School in 1960. That summer, the Dover/New Philadelphia Music Clubs awarded her a MacDowell Music Scholarship to study piano with Henry Rausch at Chautauqua, New York. She had been a piano-organ student with Mrs. Mary Margaret Haager of Sugarcreek for twelve years.

Margene Stewart joined the piano faculty at Ohio University in 1966 and is Associate Professor Emerita. She holds two performance degrees: a Bachelor of Music from Capital University and a Master of Fine Arts from Ohio University. From 1970-1998 she was coordinator of the secondary piano program for music majors and oversaw graduation requirements in keyboard for all music majors at Ohio University. She also designed and implemented a unique third-year group piano course in 1977 for the Ohio University School of Music. Along with her faculty responsibilities, she was active accompanying faculty recitals and appeared as soloist with the Ohio University Symphony Orchestra. She also judged piano competitions and adjudicated keyboard events throughout Ohio.

Margene coordinated Ohio University School of Music alumni activities from 1980-1998. The formal chartering of the School of Music Society of Alumni and Friends by the Ohio University National Alumni Association began with her organizing state-wide area meetings with alumni, which subsequently resulted in her writing the Constitution and By-laws for the School of Music Society of Alumni and Friends. She served as the Executive Secretary from 1984-1998. During her years as Executive Secretary, the school of Music Alumni Recognition Program was instituted, seven alumni reunions were realized, an annual Honors Assembly was established, and a scholarship was endowed by the music society. Margene was managing editor of Music at Ohio from 1984-1987 and the contributing editor from 1987-1992. She served on the Ohio University Alumni Advisory Council from 1983-1998.

Professor Stewart is a life-time member of Pi Kappa Lambda, the national music honorary society, and an honorary member of both Tau Beta Sigma and Kappa Kappa Psi. She served as faculty adviser to Tau Beta Sigma from 1991—1998 and was selected recipient of the North Central District Kappa Kappa Psi and Tau Beta Sigma Kathy Stevens Award in 1998. Her other honors include the 1996 School of Music Distinguished Teaching Award and the School of Music Society of Alumni and Friends Service Award in 2003. In 1997 she received the Ohio University National Alumni Association Distinguished Service Award. She is listed in the fourth and sixth editions of Who's Who Among American Teachers.

Margene Stewart retired in 2003 from Ohio University. Until recently, she adjudicated piano events in Dover/New Philadelphia and Capital University. She and her husband, James, raised a son, Garrick C. Stewart M.D., faculty member at the Harvard Medical School Cardiovascular Division, Boston. Margene and her husband of 43 years now live in Newark, Ohio, and enjoy two grandchildren.

DISTINGUISHED CITIZEN AWARD—HEINZ STUCKI



Heinz Stucki feels profoundly indebted to the Baltic-Garaway Schools. He was born in Switzerland, but grew up in Baltic to which he immigrated with his parents in 1950 when he was five. He began school speaking no English, but his dedicated and caring first grade teacher helped him to quickly adapt to America. Like most students of that period at rural schools, Heinz had few role models for succeeding in advanced education and embarking on a professional career. He is deeply grateful to the teachers who mentored him and guided him toward the sciences.

Heinz graduated from Baltic High School in 1963. He then earned his BS in Chemistry from The Ohio State University and his Ph.D. in Organic Chemistry from the University of Wisconsin.

Upon graduating from Wisconsin, Heinz had an opportunity to live in Switzerland where he worked as a research chemist with Novartis. After three years Heinz joined American Cyanamid at Willow Island, WV, as a senior process chemist. That company subsequently promoted him to their headquarters in New Jersey. Heinz's business interests grew, and after earning an MBA from Rutgers, he became manager of commercial development with Degussa. But his crowning achievement in New Jersey was meeting and marrying his wife Betty. In 1990 they returned to the Baltic area where they currently live with their two German shepherds on 43 acres of Appalachian hillside.

Heinz was the executive director of the Tuscarawas County Community Improvement Corporation for 17 years. He was a member of the Eastern Ohio Development Alliance's executive committee and chaired the education/technology committee. He served on KSU Tuscarawas' continuing education, engineering technology, and plastics education advisory committees. He served on Tuscarawas County's welfare reform planning committee, labor management council, farmland preservation taskforce, and chamber of commerce board of directors. Heinz is a past president of the Ohio Development Association and is the current president of the Baltic Alumni Association.

He was a chief intelligence analyst in the U S Army Reserve.
